THE GREATEST GIFT


A QUEST FOR GRANDMA'S PRESENT




If you shovel snow, turn to page 5.

If you walk dogs, turn to page 7.


If you sell hot cocoa, turn to page 9.




Turn back to page 3 and pick again.

If you choose Charley Chonka's Chocolates, turn to page 15.


If you choose Freewill Thrift Store, turn to page 17.

CHARLEY CHOMKA'S CHOCOLATES



If you buy the dragon carving, turn to page 31. If you donate your present money, turn to page 29.



If you pick a different store, turn back to 13.


You see Books a Billion, Jay Jewelers and We R






If you buy the earrings, turn to page 31. If you donate your present money, turn to page 29.


If you buy yourself the Armo set, turn to page 33.
