

Matt. 2:1-11. After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi (*magos*) from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, “Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him.”

When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. When he had called together all the people’s chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Christ was to be born.

“In Bethlehem in Judea,” they replied, “for this is what the prophet has written:

““But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will be the shepherd of my people Israel.””

Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, “Go and make a careful search for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him.” After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen in the east went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed.

On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh.

Four Facts About “The Star of Bethlehem”

1. In 7 BC Jupiter and Saturn converged under the sign of Pisces 3 times (**May 27, Oct 5, Dec 1**). Happens every 853 years. The last of the three convergences included Mars.

2. In ancient astrology,

Jupiter = “the King’s star”

Saturn = “Israel’s star”/ “the messiah’s star”

Mars = war star

Pisces = “House of Hebrews”

3. From Babylon, the convergencies were seen directly over Palestine.

4. Walking from Jerusalem, the last convergence on the evening of Dec. 1 would have led them directly to Bethlehem (the star moved west; the road curved southwest).
