On a Sabbath Jesus was teaching in one of the synagogues, and a woman was there who had been crippled by a spirit for eighteen years.










Satan is...

"the god of this age" (2 Corinthians 4:4) and the "principality and power of the air" (Ephesians 2:2) who "controls the entire world" (I John 5:19)




