

14 Then one of the Twelve, the one called Judas Iscariot, went to the chief priests 15 and asked, "What are you willing to give me if I hand him over to you?" So they counted out for him thirty silver coins.

16 From then on Judas watched for an opportunity to hand him over.

17 On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, the disciples went to Jesus and asked, "Where do you want us to celebrate the Passover with you?"

18 He answered, "Go into the city and buy a certain kind of wine and two young lambs, and you will find everything ready for you to celebrate the Passover with my disciples." 19 So the disciples did as Jesus had said and prepared the Passover.

20 When evening came, Jesus was reclining at the table with the twelve. 21 And while they were eating, he said to them, "The Son of Man will be betrayed by one of you who is sitting at the table with me." 22 They were very sad and began to say to him one after another, "Lord, am I?"

23 He replied, "The one who has dipped his hand into the bowl with me will betray me." 24 The Son of Man will be betrayed about this time. But woe to that man who betrays him!"

25 He who would betray him, said, "Lord, am I?"

26 He replied, "It is you."

27 After saying this, Jesus took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Eat, this is my body."

28 Then he took the cup, gave thanks and offered it to them, all of you. 28 This is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. 29 I tell you, I will not drink from now on until that day when I drink with you in my Father's kingdom."

30 After singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

47 While he was still speaking, Judas, one of the Twelve, arrived. With him was a large crowd armed with swords and clubs, sent from the chief priests and the scribes and the Pharisees.

48 He went to Jesus and said, "Greetings, Rabbi!"

49 He replied, "Greetings, friend."

50 Judas went forward with the crowd, and he kissed Jesus on the cheek. 51 But Jesus said to him, "Friend, what are you doing?"

52 "Put your sword back in its place," Jesus said to him, "for all who draw the sword will die by the sword."

53 Do you think I cannot call on my Father, and he will at once put at my disposal more than twelve legions of angels? 54 But how then would the Scriptures be fulfilled that say it must happen in this way?"

55 At that time Jesus said to the crowd, "Am I leading a rebellion, that you have come here with swords and clubs to capture me? Every day I sat in the temple courts teaching, and you did not arrest me. 56 But this has all taken place that the writings of the prophets might be fulfilled." Then all the disciples deserted him and fled.

3 When Judas, who had betrayed him, saw that Jesus was condemned, he was seized with remorse and returned the thirty silver coins to the chief priests and the elders.

4 "I have sinned," he said, "for I have betrayed innocent blood."

"What is that to us?" they replied. "That's your responsibility."

5 So Judas threw the money into the temple and left. Then he went away and hanged himself.

JUDAS CHRISTIANITY



Luke 22:1-6

Now the Festival of Unleavened Bread, called the Passover, was approaching, and the chief priests and the teachers of the law were looking for some way to get rid of Jesus, for they were afraid of the people. Then Satan entered Judas, called Iscariot, one of the Twelve.

And Judas went to the chief priests and the officers of the temple guard and discussed with them how he might betray Jesus. They were delighted and agreed to give him money. He consented, and watched for an opportunity to hand Jesus over to them when no crowd was present.

Luke 22:21-23

But the hand of him who is going to betray me is with mine on the table. The Son of Man will go as it has been decreed. But woe to that man who betrays him!” They began to question among themselves which of them it might be who would do this.

I. Was Judas Fated to Betray Jesus?

John 6:64

Jesus had known from the beginning which of them did not believe and who would betray him.

John 13:18

“I am not referring to all of you; I know those I have chosen. But this is to fulfill this passage of Scripture: ‘He who shared my bread has lifted up his heel against me.’

John 17:12

While I was with them, I protected them and kept them safe by that name you gave me. None has been lost except the one doomed to destruction so that Scripture would be fulfilled.

a) **“From the beginning”** [ex archās]?
= the start or origin of the topic under discussion (who would betray Jesus)

b) **“Doomed for destruction”** ?

[hō hious apōleias]

= “son of destruction”

= “one now suited for destruction”

c) **“to fulfill scripture”**

Psalm 41:9
