Symbols of the Resurrection Story Key

- 1. Donkey and palm branches:** Symbolizes Jesus's triumphal entry into Jerusalem (Matthew 21)
- 2. Coin:** Symbolizes Judas betraying Jesus (Matthew 26:14-16)
- 3. Washcloth:** Symbolizes Jesus washing his disciples' feet (John 13:1-17)
- 4. Bread and cup:** Symbolizes the Last Supper (Matthew 26:17-30)
- 5. Praying hands:** Symbolizes Jesus praying in the garden of Gethsemane (Matthew 26:36-46)
- 6. Leather:** Symbolizes Jesus being beaten (Mark 15:1-15)
- 7. Cross:** Symbolizes Jesus being crucified (Matthew 27:31)
- 8. Dice:** Symbolizes soldiers playing a game for Jesus's clothes (Matthew 27:35)
- 9. Spear:** Symbolizes Soldiers piercing Jesus with a spear to make sure he's dead (John 19:34)
- 10. Linen cloth:** Symbolizes Jesus's body being wrapped for burial (Matthew 27:57-60)
- 11. Stone:** Symbolizes the stone sealing Jesus's tomb shut (Matthew 27:62-66)
- 12. Empty tomb:** Symbolizes that Jesus is risen from the dead (Matthew 28:1-10)

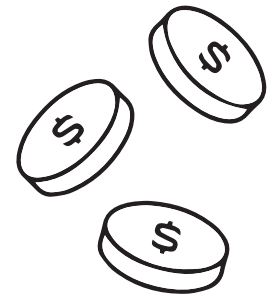


1. Jesus's triumphal entry into Jerusalem

— Matthew 21:9

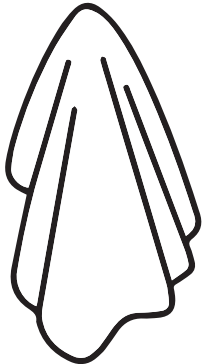
2. Judas betrays Jesus

3. Jesus washes his disciples' feet

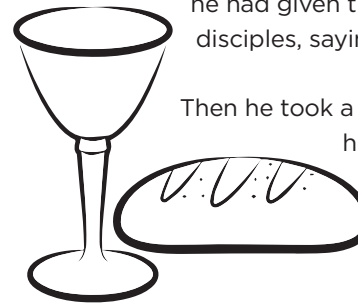
Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you.

4. The Last Supper

— Matthew 26:26-28



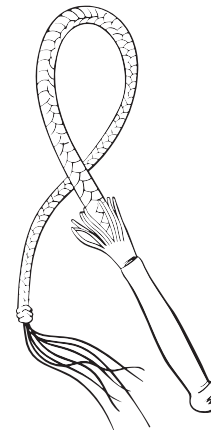
5. Jesus prays in the garden of Gethsemane

6. Jesus is whipped

Wanting to satisfy the crowd, Pilate released Barabbas to them. He had Jesus flogged, and handed him over to be crucified.

7. Jesus is crucified

After they had mocked him, they took off the robe and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him away to crucify him.

8. Soldiers play a game for Jesus's clothes

When they had crucified him, they divided up his clothes by casting lots.

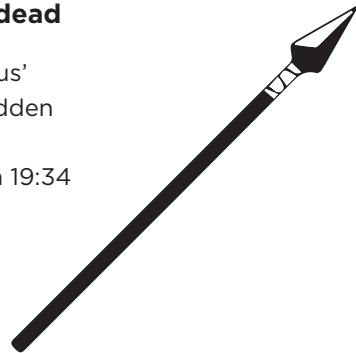

One of the soldiers pierced Jesus' side with a spear, bringing a sudden flow of blood and water.

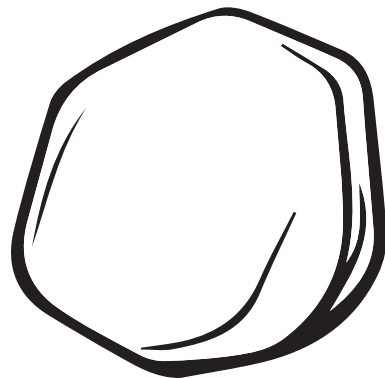

11. Jesus's tomb is sealed shut with a stone

"Take a guard," Pilate answered. "Go, make the tomb as secure as you know how." So they went and made the tomb secure by putting a seal on the stone and posting the guard.

12. Jesus is risen from the dead

The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said.
