ago while at a debriefing for people like us, who left parts of our hearts in another country where not a lot of people have heard the sweet, freeing truths about Jesus.

The ten of us talked late into the night, sharing glorious stories of God inspired creative access ministries like coffee shops and fitness gyms in some of the most closed countries in the world. We relived the traumas of living through earthquakes and terrorist attacks. We laughed about hilarious attempts of recreating holiday traditions, and stood in awe at how French children eat in courses at tiny tables in their school "cafeterias." Some shared the reason they never hung pictures on the wall was because of the continual limbo they lived in, not knowing if their visas would be renewed or not. We ached over believers and seekers left behind and trust God to continue to do the work, without us.

I felt so known, though I had never met most of the men and women who sat around that simple table. Our stories and experiences were honored, without being novel. We understood the pain of leaving a place and people whom we loved very much, even though we understood it was God calling and timing that brought us back to the United States. It was an abundant gift to sit with these fellow Christ-followers and process the immense transition we are experiencing in moving back to the U.S. or to another country. It also felt like a foretaste of heaven where we'll have ample time to share endless God stories and learn about how He continued to call people to Himself.
